## **NON FICTION MATERIALS**

**E 392.3 SHE Shemie, Bonnie. Houses of wood : native dwellings : the Northwest Coast. 1992**

Describes the construction, decoration, and use of the wooden houses built by the native people of the Northwest coast from Oregon up to southeast Alaska.

**E 917.8 ZAD Zadram Dan and Keely, John. Lewis and Clark : western trailblazers. 1988**

An easy-to-read account of the expedition to explore the Louisiana Territory and the two men who led it.

**917.8 MCG McGarth, Patrick. The Lewis and Clark expedition. 1985.**

An account of the 1804-1806 Lewis and Clark expedition which explored the unknown Louisiana Purchase territory and the Pacific Northwest from St. Louis to the mouth of the Columbia River.

**917.8 SCH Schanzer, Rosalyn. How we crossed the West: The adventures of Lewis & Clark. 1997.**

**918.80 KRO Kroll, Steven and Williams, Richard. Lewis and Clark: explorers of the American West. 1994.**

Introduces Meriwether Lewis and William Clark and their expedition of 1804-6 through the Louisiana Territory, opening the land from the Mississippi River to the Pacific Ocean.

**971.9 HAN Hancock, Lyn. Northwest Territories. 1992**

Describes the geography, history, and people of the Northwest Territories.

**B COL C Christian, Mary Blount and Kubinyi, Laszlo. Who'd believe John Colter? 1993.**

Examines the life of the nineteenth-century woodsman John Colter and describes his experiences accompanying the Lewis and Clark Expedition and, later, as an explorer on his own.

**B JOS F Fox, Virginia. Chief Joseph of the Nez Perce Indians : champion of liberty. 1992.**

Relates the life story of the Nez Perce Indian chief who led his people on a great trek to escape the injustices of the American government.

**B LEW/CLA K      Kozar, Richard. Lewis & Clark/Explorers of the Louisiana Purchase. 2000**

A biography of the team who explored the Louisiana Purchase territory while seeking the elusive Northwest Passage to the Pacific Ocean.

**B SAC A              Adler, David and Brown, Dan. A picture book of Sacagawea. 2000.**

A biography of the Shoshone woman who joined the Lewis and Clark expedition.

**B SAC B              Brown, Marion Marsh. Sacagawea : Indian interpreter to Lewis and Clark. 1988**

Relates the story of the young Shoshoni Indian woman who acted as a guide and interpreter for the Lewis and Clark expedition.

**B SAC M              Milton, Joyce and Hehenberger, Shelly. Sacajawea : her true story. 2001**

Introduces the life of the Shoshone woman Sacajawea, who accompanied the Lewis and Clark Expedition through the American Wilderness.

**B SEA MON      Montgomery, Elizabeth Rider. Chief Seattle/ Great Statesman. 1966.**

About Chief Seattle of the Suquamish tribe, one of the tribes from the Puget Sound area and the Pacific Northwest Coast Indians.

**REF 920 AVE      Avery, Susan and Skinner, Linda. Extraordinary American Indians. 1992**

Discusses the lives and accomplishments of the outstanding Native Americans from the eighteenth century to the present, including Wilma Mankiller, Billy Mills, Sacagawea, Louis Ballard, and Will Rogers.
